People's Stories

Sanjay Joshi



It is almost four years since I opened the door to Jesus and he transformed my life.


I was born into a devout Hindu Brahmin family. My parents encouraged me to be open and although I followed the Hindu rituals for over 50 years, in my heart it never seemed enough and there was a constant struggle. Ranmi (my wife I met at Uni in 1981) had unknowingly to me, been prodding me towards life with Jesus all along. I was steadfast in my denial but somehow started accompanying her to St. Stephen's. It all changed dramatically in Spring 2014, with a visit to the National Gallery and being drawn to Ruben's, "The Miraculous Draught of Fishes" Steve Newbold's preached a sermon on this very topic the next day and I experienced the incredible receiving of the Holy Spirit as I felt the light of God entering me and a voice saying, "accept me". I knew I was re-born. I approached Steve and was baptised in June 2014. Since then my faith has grown and I now serve as the St Stephen's Treasurer.

There have been periods of struggle, particularly after my father's death last July when I sub-consciously drifted. A recent Open to God session at church with John Ryeland, was an important step. During prayer, I audibly heard Jesus whispering "I am here my son I am always here for you let me back into your heart and read my words and pray". The Lent Book "Say it to God" by Luigi Gioia, has been part of this Christian journey and a renewed commitment, as I now realise that "The Lord's Prayer" and reading the Bible have become central to my daily life – not a ritual but a daily occurrence just like breathing, eating, walking and talking.

I used to wonder why I wasted 50 years of my life but the best is ahead of me as I know that with Jesus I have so much to discover and so much to do. I know my life has been transformed and I know there will be periods of struggle but with Jesus in my life nothing will be too difficult.

Looking forward to Easter, two of the books, for old and young, which tell the story of our Lord's death and resurrection, and what it means for us today.






