

People's Stories Morgen Edwards



I was christened when I was a baby but I've not always been a practising Christian, from memory we only went to Church at Christmas. I didn't start attending church regularly until I was 14 or 15 when a Youth Group started at St Michael & All Angels, W4 which I began attending with friends. A group of us were asked whether we'd considered getting Confirmed so we started attending classes: a short while later we were standing in front of the Bishop of Kensington. After this I began to serve in the Sunday services. It felt good to be part of something.

Around the same time I started working and working life began to take over. As I was still at school I could only work weekends which meant that I let church slide. There was a Christian Union at school but I'm sad to say I never got involved.

Skip forward a few years and I met Tim. He comes from a church family who attended St Stephen's for many years so I started coming along with them until Tim and I bought our first house and moved to Ruislip. Church life slipped again.

After we had our first child, Grace, we decided we needed to find a church again. We went to a few local to us but the fit wasn't right so we decide to 'come home'. After maternity leave we decided that I should work part time and unfortunately the company I worked for couldn't accommodate that so I needed to find a new job. After a tricky month at a local company, and some serious prayers for something better suited, a job came up at St Stephen's and I jumped at it. I am so glad I did.


I am the Communications Manager which means I work in the Church Office three days a week. I answer calls and speak to people who come in. I am responsible for the church's website, social media, TV and the Wednesday and Sunday rotas. I also co-publish the Annual Review Booklet with Mary Ann Auckland, I am Electoral Roll Officer and assist Steve with certain things for his role as Area Dean.

I have been here almost three years and thoroughly enjoy it. Not only it is a nicer place to work but I don't have to worry about expressing my faith. Since being back at St Stephen's I have joined the reading and chalice rotas, attended the Alpha course, which I would honestly recommend to everyone, started a book club and am a Sparklers leader.


Last month I attended the New Wine Leadership Conference with a group from church. It was an intense two days but I thoroughly enjoyed it. I had only really experienced that kind of powerful worship twice before but I was timid in expressing myself then. This time I felt freed, the talks and prayer times really impacted me and I honestly felt at times that He was holding my hand. I feel my faith has grown as a result.

Bookstall

We have a wide range of books and Bibles for all ages. This month's suggestions for reading are a well known book of Tom Wright's about faith, and a book by Sam Wells about how to live out our faith.



The classic work available in paperback for the first time: The Renowned Bible scholar, Anglican bishop, and bestselling author N. T. Wright breaks down the barriers that prevent us from fully engaging with the story of Jesus in the Bible. Wright summarizes a lifetime of study of Jesus and the New Testament in order to present for a general audience who Jesus was and is. In Simply Jesus, we are invited to hear one of our leading scholars introduce the story of the carpenter's son from Nazareth as if we were hearing it for the first time.



Priests and pastoral caregivers often accompany people who are struggling to negotiate experiences of sickness, bereavement or anxiety. There are no easy answers in such situations, no formulaic remedies, no slick theological explanations. The process of being present, listening and responding is demanding and requires skills and wisdom beyond ministers' own experience. Often, caregivers feel they receive more than they give in such encounters. Samuel Wells reflects theologically and pastorally on twenty such encounters that were both hugely challenging and hugely instructive for him. The result is a book of profound practical wisdom and understanding that will inform and enrich pastoral ministry for all who read it.
